 - Quality of coaching
 - Pathways for U/20 athletes







Clubmark

Introduced by Sport England in 2002. For clubs with young athletes.

- Aims to spread good practice, give parents confidence etc.
- Accreditation requires clubs to comply with minimum operating standards in four areas:
 - Programme (coaching; training; competition)
 - Duty of care and child protection
 - 3. Sports equity and ethics
 - 4. Club management

- Clubmark Accreditation already achieved by many local clubs (e.g. Abingdon; Oxford City)
- Becoming a pre-requisite to appear in centrally produced publicity; receive grants (including Athletics Networks)

'SWOT' Analysis Weaknesses

- Very Poor local training facilities in Winter.
- School field in summer, still limited but better.
- Lots of juniors and vets relatively fewer seniors.
- Too few people to do too much. In particular not enough coaches, especially for number of young athletes.
- No good training slot for just-after-beginner adult runners. (Since fixed)
- No senior athletics team being fielded.
- Limited opportunities for competition at highest level for best (especially youngsters).



'SWOT' Analysis Threats

- Loss of coaches/leaders.
- Loss of such venues as we have (parking issues at Wantage Leisure centre may make our use of that area less easy.)



'SWOT' Analysis Opportunities

- Possibility of air hall for Winter training.
- New members from JogEngland scheme.

- Good membership, lots of competitions, full calendar.
- Playing a part as a club in Oxfordshire.
